Prioritizing Formational Pedagogy in Schools

In a recent article in "The Link," Darren Spyksma (SCSBC Associate Executive Director) reflected on the impact that our daily choices make in a classroom and how those decisions can "become small but powerful acts of discipleship that teach belonging, responsibility, grace, and community." We're continuing to share Darren's reflection questions in each of $\underline{\text{the areas he focuses on}}$ and adding more questions connected to TfT practices:

- The Way We Handle Mistakes:
 - 1. How does the way I handle mistakes reflect the character of Christ?
 - 2. How do discipline processes in my class show grace and empathy to the developing brains of the students in my classroom?
 - 3. TfT How do the Habits of Learning help us curate classroom norms that encourage students to embrace a growth mindset (i.e., learn from failure)?
 - 4. TfT How can the structure of "Opening Circles" foster belonging creating spaces where learners feel safe making mistakes and taking responsibility for their actions?
